ORDER APPROVING DEED.

NOW, on this the 14th day of June, 1923, came on for hearing the petition of John Spade praying an order of this Court approving a deed conveying the interest of said John Spade and Josie Spade in and to certain lands allotted to Nannie Spade, deceased, and petitioners appearing in person and by attorneys, Vance & Bliss and the Court having examined the petition and the deed submitted for approval, having heard the testimony of petition and evidence as to the value of said land, and being fully advised in the premises, finds:

That Nannie Spade was a full blood Cherokee Indian Roll No. 25381, and received in allotment as such citizen of the Cherokee Nation, the following described lands in Tulsa County,

Oklahoma, to-wit:

Lots Three and Four of Section Five, Township twenty-one North, Range Fourteen East.

The Court finds that the said Nannie Spade died after receiving said land in allotment, in and a permanent resident of Cherokee County, Oklahoma, on the 27th day of April, 1923; that she was the owner of the lands above described at the time of her death; that she left as her sole
