Davis, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and acting as such within Tulsa County, Oklahoma, came Chesley Starr, who after being duly sworn according to law, says that his name is Chesley Starr that his age is 47 years that he is a citizen by blood of the Creek Nation, that he knew Sunday Grayson during his life time, that Sunday Grayson died out or about the 22nd day of May 1903.

That Sunday Grayson was a single man at the time of his death that he was never married. Affiant further states that Sunday Grayson left no children surviving him that his father and mother both died prior to his death and that he left surviving him as his sole and only heirs his sisters Sufy Grayson now Susan Harris, and Janie Grayson and his brothers Buck Grayson and Walter Grayson. Affiant states that from his own personal knowledge of the family of Sunday Grayson deceased that these facts are true, that he has no interest in the affairs of the heirs of Sunday Grayson and that he is not related to Sunday Grayson or to any of his heirs.
