

Quit Claim Deed.

This Indenture made this 12th day of Sept, 1908, between Belle C. Daugherty and P. J. Daugherty his wife parties of the first part, of Catoosa Okla. and Francis L. Thompson, party of the second part of Tulsa County, Okla.

Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have revised, released, sold, conveyed, quitclaimed, and by these presents, do remise, release sell and convey and grant unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever the right to perpetual occupancy thereof, and do also grant and assign all the right, title, interest, claim and possession which the said parties of the first part have in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of land, situated in Tulsa County, Okla., described as follows, to wit: NE 1/4 of NE 1/4 of sec. 28, township 20 N. and range 14 E.

Do Have and Do Hold the same together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim of the said parties of the first part, either in law or equity forever.
