

General Warranted.

This Warranted, Made this twenty second day of April A.D. 1861.
Between James W. Rogers, Juror, a single man of the City of St. Louis, and
the City of Missouri, party of the first part, and versus Wm. Miller of
Panama, Illinois, party of the second part.

Whereas the said party of the first part, in consideration of the
sum of one hundred forty five and no other, the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged, do hereby these, peace, goodly, benign, and
well and amey unto the said party of the second part, have their
and we agree, all the foregoing demanded and asked, without law
the Book Making, Indian Territory, &c.

All of the same (19) & the (10) in that thirty seven (37) of 19 and
in that addition, a condition of the said party of the second part
quantity section fourteen, the said party of the second part, we agree
to give land, according to the amount of that thirty seven, recorded
in the office of the Deputy Clerk of the United States Treasury
and the office of the Clerk of the Indian Territory, in that
last page 1639. To have and to hold the same, together with

all the appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise
appertaining forever. And said party of the first part for
himself, his heirs, executors or administrators, shall lawfully
acquire, it and with said party of the second part, that the
said warrant made, forever defend the title to the same
unto said party of the second part and his heirs and assigns,
against all and every person, firm or company, lawfully
claiming the same. And in that behalf, the said party
of the first part has hereunto set his hand and seal the day
and year first above written. James W. Rogers, Juror
