This matter came on to be heard on this, the 11 day of November, 1908,
upon the petition of Sunday Lott, as an heir at law of the said Sunday
Lott, deceased, asking the Court to appoint a deed of conveyance
by him executed, conveying a portion of said allotment to Charles
L. Brayer, the petitioner appearing in person and by his attorneys,
Abbot & Snow, and the Court after hearing the testimony and
examination of counsel found:

That the allegations in said petition contained are true, that the
said Sunday Lott, deceased, was a full blood Creek Indian, duly
enrolled, that there was allotted to him of the land of the Creek
Nation, the following described lands, situated in what is now
Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit: being a portion of
said Sunday Lott, deceased, tract:
