Deed of Trust

To all whom these Presents shall come Greeting:

Be it known that this agreement witnesses that I, Major Freeman do hereby appoint and constitute George McKeehan of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, my legal and lawful Trustee to carry into effect and to execute the actor trust hereinafter mentioned and set forth, upon the conditions and for the purposes therein mentioned; Now, there fore, be it known that I, Major Freeman was convicted and sentenced by the United States Court for and within the Northern Judicial District of the Indian Territory sitting at Muskogee, I. T. on the 27th day of April, 1898, in the case of United States vs Major Freeman alias Major Mupra to be imprisoned in Ohio Penitentiary, situated at Columbus Ohio, for the period of my natural life at hard labor, and that said sentence is still in full force and effect.

That I am seized of the following real property, to wit, the northeast one fourth (1/4) of section 24, Township 19 north range 14 east, formerly Creek Nation Indian Territory, now Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma containing 160 acres more or less by virtue of being a full blood Creek Indian as appears from the approved Creek Rolls, Indians by blood, number 2316 of said rolls, and by virtue of deeds to the said premises above described, from the Creek or Muskogee Nation, and approved by the Interior Department of the United States Government.

That I have a kinsman, who is my uncle, to wit, William Berryhill who lives at Courta, Oklahoma for whom I desire to make provision out of said property; that my said imprisonment prevents me from taking charge of my said land which is valuable for agricultural purposes, consequently the same is wholly neglected, and my said uncle and kinsman is prevented from receiving any benefit therefrom and being desirous of making a provision and settlement for his benefit this trust is made and created.
