Order confirming sale

A hearing was had in the above entitled cause on the 25th day of November, 1905, said date being a regular court day of November, 1905 Term of the County Court in and for Tulsa County, Oklahoma, on the return of sale of oil and gas mining lease made by George L. Campbell, Guardian of England Campbell, minor, to E. T. Braden, of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, said Guardian being represented by his attorney Haskell B. Talley, and E. T. Braden of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, being represented by his agent, J. Truman Wipac, and it appearing to the Court that proper answer of notice as provided by law had been made of the time, place and object of said proceedings, and no parties appearing at the time fixed in the notice for the confirmation of the said sale to oppose the confirmation thereof, and it further appearing to the Court that the apprehension of said oil and gas mining rights, ^{posting of} notice of sale, waiver by the map of this practice and other proceedings had herein more regular and in conformity to the law, and the Court being fully advised in the premises after a full examination of the records and returns herein and of all evidence submitted in support thereof, finds:

That in pursuance of said order of sale, said George L. Campbell, as Guardian of England Campbell, minor, on the 25th day of November, 1905, sold an oil and gas mining lease on said estate described as follows:

Braden of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, on the following terms, to wit: for the sum of eight dollars cash and all costs of said sale and royalty at 1/2 per cent of all crude oil marketed from said Graham, and at 20c. or per annum for each gas well from which gas is ~~extracted~~ ^{produced}. The said sale was made after due notice of notice and answer by the report of law as provided by such order of sales that said purchaser was the highest bidder therefor, and said sum the highest and best bid, that said sale was legally made and fairly conducted.
