of the power and authority vested in me by the afore-
said Act of Congress of the United States hereby
grant, sell and convey unto the said Sarah E. Trotter
her heirs and assigns forever all the right title
and interest of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation
aforesaid, in and to Lot numbered four, in block
numbered twenty seven in the Town of Tulsa,
Muskogee (Creek) Nation Indian Territory, and
according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.

In witness whereof, I, the Principal Chief of
the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, have hereunto set
my hand and caused the Great seal of said Nation
to be affixed at the date hereinafter shown.
