

awarded the real estate described hereinbefore to Wilson S. Crocker, who has paid thirty-three and ⁵⁰/₁₀₀ (\$33.50) dollars the full amount of the purchase price into the treasury of the United States to the credit of the Muskogee or Creek Nation of Indians with the United States Indian Agent at Muskogee Indian Territory and is therefore entitled to a patent.

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States hereby grant, sell and convey unto the said Wilson S. Crocker, his heirs and assigns forever all the right, title and interest of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, aforesaid in and to lots numbered one and two in block numbered twenty seven in the Town of Tulsa Muskogee (Creek) Nation, Indian Territory and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.

In Witness Whereof, I, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the great seal of said nation to be affixed at the date hereinafter shown.
