

General Warranty Deed.

This Indenture made this seventeenth day of April, A.D. 1907, between James D. Capron, junior, a single man of the City of St. Louis, in the State of Missouri, party of the first part, and Irvin T. Snyder, of Circleville, Ohio, party of the second part.

Witnesseth, the said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of two hundred eighty ~~no~~ 100 dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, does by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all the following described real estate, situated in the Creek Nation Indian Territory, to wit: all of lot forty five (45) and forty six (46) in Block forty seven (47) of West Tulsa Addition a subdivision of the east half of the north west quarter of section fourteen township nineteen, north, range twelve east, according to the amended plat thereof, recorded in the office of the Deputy Clerk of the United States Court and Ex officio Recorder of Tulsa, Indian Territory, in Book 2, page 639.

To Have and to hold the same together with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said party of the first part for himself, his heirs, executors or administrators, does hereby covenant to and with said party of the second part, that he will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, against all and every person whomsoever lawfully claiming the same.
