and designated upon the plat thereof as:
lot number two (2) block number twenty nine (29)
lot number three (3) block number twenty nine (29)
together with all the improvements thereon and
the appurtenances thereto belonging and passing
the title to the same. To have and to hold the
designated premises unto the said Alameda
Divide, successors and assigns forever, they
and their heirs, assigns and assigns forever
clear and discharged of and from all former
grants, charges, taxes, judgments, mortgages and
other liens and encumbrances of whatever
