

same shall remain for all general traffic purposes, a width of sixty (60) feet COMPARED

Provided, however, that the City of Tulsa, reserves and shall retain forever, the right to construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain, and operate sanitary sewers and other appurtenances thereto appertaining now located in said portion of said street vacated, or which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said portion of said street vacated, with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purposes above indicated, and the said portion of said street vacated is hereby maintained by the City of Tulsa, upon which the City of Tulsa may allow public service corporations, companies, individuals or itself to construct, maintain and operate facilities for public utilities, including poles, wires, pipes, conduits, and other necessary accessories; and

Provided further that the portion of said street vacated shall be construed to mean sufficient space for the purposes above specified; and provided further, that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of Paragraph Eleven (11) of Section Six (6) of Article Two (2) of the Charter of the City of Tulsa.

SECTION 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, insofar as such conflicts exists, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public welfare and safety by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

SPECIAL SEWER CONTRACT.

BY ORDER OF MR. SCHULTZ

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this the 19th day of March, 1923, by and between the CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA, party of the first part, and E. Westerman of Tulsa County, Okla., State, part of the second part; WITNESSETH

For and in consideration of the use of and connection with the sewer system in SEWER DISTRICT NO. 186 of said City of Tulsa, and the covenants and agreements herein contained, the said part of the second part do hereby covenant and agree with the said City of Tulsa, Okla., as follows, to-wit:

That the said party of the second part the fee owner of the following
