Spurlock, the receipt of which is hereby full acknowledged.

HAVE GRANTED. SOLD AND CONVEYED and by these presents do GRANT, SELL AND CONVEY unto the said Mrs. Nellie B. Spurlock of the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, all that certain piece parcel or tract of land lying and being situated in Tulsa County, and being Lot #191 in Lyndale Section, containing 200 square feet, be the same more or less out of Rose Hill Burial Park as more fully appears from map of said Burial Park hereby referred to and made a part hereof.
