of the Original Townsite to the City of Tulsa, according to the recorded  
plat thereof,

Together with all and singular hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the above described premises unto the said party of the second part its heirs and assigns, so that neither the said party of the first part or any person in her name and behalf, shall or will hereafter claim or demand any right or title to the said premises or any part thereof; but they and every one of them shall by these presents be excluded and forever barred.
