FINDING OF HEIRSHIP AND DISCHARGE OF SURETIES.

Now on this 31st day of March, 1923, the same being one of the regular term days of this court, this cause came on for hearing upon the final report of the administrator.

And it appearing that Will Cherry is the duly appointed, qualified and acting administrator, having been qualified on the 6th day of March, 1922; that thereafter, J. S. Shaver, E. L. Kersey and J. H. Goodwin were appointed appraisers on to-wit: the 6th day of March, 1922; that on the 15th day of March, 1922, said appraisers filed their sworn return

And it further appearing that on the 7th day of March, 1922, notice to creditors was duly filed and publication made in Tulsa Daily Legal News of Tulsa, Oklahoma, the first publication being on the 9th day of March and the last one on the 23 day of March, 1922; that more than four months have elapsed since notice to creditors was given but that no claims of any kind have been filed against said estate.

And it further appearing from the first and final report of the administrator that no funds have come into his hands and none have been paid out, the debts of decedent having been long since settled and that the only thing necessary to be done in closing the estate and discharging the administrator, is the finding of heirship and approval of the final report.

And it further appearing that the next of kin and heirs at law of decedent are James Cherry, 57 years old, husband; Jasper Cherry, son, 27 years old; and Manuel Cherry, son, age 23.

And it further appearing that James Cherry, the husband, has filed in this court his waiver and consent that the hereinafter appraised real estate should be vested solely and absolutely in his two son, viz: Jasper and Manuel Cherry.

It is therefore by the court ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED THAT Jasper Cherry and Manuel Cherry be and they are hereby declared the only next of kin and heirs at law of the decedent, Lizzie Cherry and that the following real estate, heretofore appraised, be vested solely, absolutely and in fee in Jasper Cherry and Manuel Cherry;
