WHEREAS, by virtue of an order of sale issued out of and under the seal of the District Court in and for Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, under date of the 3rd day of February, 1923, upon judgments in favor of the plaintiff and in favor of the defendant, Sue Richardson, for the sum of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-two and O2/100 (\$4.892.02) Dollars and costs and interest and for the sum of One Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-four and 30/100 (\$1.364.30) and costs and interest, respectively, recovered in said court on the 2nd day of August, 1922, in case No. 18279, entitled R.
