P E T I T I O N .

Come now Callie Island, formerly Callie Fisher, and Cheparney Fisher, together with George Island, husband of Callie Island and Eunice Fisher, the wife of Cheparney Fisher, and represent to the Court that the said Callie Island and Cheparney Fisher are the only children, and are the heirs at law, and the only heirs at law of Amos Fisher, deceased.

That the said Amos Fisher was a permanent resident of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, at the Town of Fisher, and resided there at the time of his death; that he was the allottee among other lands, of the following:

The South Half (S $\frac{1}{2}$) and the Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$)
of the Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Sec. 7, Town 19,
Range 11, E.I.M., in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, excepting
the right of way, hereinafter described.

That the said Amos Fisher departed this life on or about the 24th. day of June, 1923, and at the time of his death was the owner of the lands hereinbefore described, excepting the portion thereof occupied as a right of way by the St. Louis & San Francisco Railway Company, otherwise known as the A.V. & W., Railway Company, and excepting also the right of way of the Tulsa County paved highway parallel to said railroad through and across the said lands.

The said Amos Fisher was a full blood Creek Indian, Roll No. 8810, and your Petitioners, except Eunice Fisher, a White woman, are full blood Creek Indians, the said Callie Island being enrolled as No. 3158 on the Tribal Rolls of the Creek Nation, and the said Cheparney Fisher being enrolled as No. 8812 on said rolls, and the said George Island being enrolled as No. 3157, on said rolls.
