This Indenture made this 16th day of February, 1923, between R. D. Sanford of the County of Tulsa, and State of Oklahoma, the duly elected and qualified Sheriff of said County and State, as such Sheriff, party of the first part, and Jno. L. Ward of Tulsa, Oklahoma, party of the second part.
