ORIGINAL OIL AND GAS MINING LEASE.

This cause coming on for final hearing before the County Court of Hughes County, Oklahoma, on the 3rd day of August, 1921, the same being a regular day of the _____, July, 1921, term of Court in and for said County, upon the return of the guardian, R. B. Wilson, herein, and the report of said guardian's proceedings under the order authorizing the modification of the original oil and gas lease by contract heretofore made, and it having been proven to the Court that in pursuance of said order of court, and as ordered by the Court, the said guardian has entered into a contract with the Noco-Mexican Oil Company, modifying the terms of the original oil and gas lease, covering the

Southwest quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of section twenty five
(25) township nineteen (19) north, range eleven
(11) east, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, containing 160
acres, more or less,

the said contract modifying the original oil and gas mining lease to remain in force for the period of the minority of said ward, and so much longer thereafter as natural gas is produced from said premises in paying quantities.

And it appearing to the Court that due notice has been given as provided by law by the guardian to all interested parties of the proposal to modify said oil and gas mining lease by contract, and that all interested parties have had notice as required by law of the time and place when said contract would be entered into, and there being no objection or protests entered or made to the making of said contract.

And it appearing to the Court that the premises herein before described have been developed for natural gas, and that seven (7) producing wells have been drilled thereon, and that the production of natural gas from said wells has depleted the volume of natural gas capable of being produced therefrom so that there is now approximately
