ORDER APPROVING DEED BY FULL BLOOD INDIAN HEIR.

Now, on this 30th day of April, 1923, the above matter came on fo be hear_upon the verified petition of Dave Bruner for the approval of a certain warranty deed made, executed and delivered by him to Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, on the 30th day of April, 1923, and said petitioner appearing in peron and by his attorney Jas. S. Watson, and said cause being now submitted to the court for its approval, and the court proceeded to hear to hear the evidence produced in support of said petition, and being fully advised in the premises, finds:

That the said Dave Bruner, the grantor in said deed and the petitioner herein, and Dave Bruner Anderson, is one and the same person, the said Dave Bruner having been adopted as Dave Bruner Anderson but was enrolled on the tribal rolls of the Creek Nation as Dave Bruner, opposite roll No. 2919, as a full blood Creek Indian; that Sarah Holder, deceased, was a full blood Creek Indian citizen, duly enrolled as such on the tribal rolls of the Creek Nation, opposite Roll No. 9795; that Josie Bruner deceased, was a full blood Creek Indian citizen, duly entolled as such on the tribal rolls of the Creek Nation, opposite Roll No. 2920.

That the said Sarah Holder died intestate near the town of Sapulpa, State of Oklahoma, on or about the 2nd day of Fenruary, 1900, being at the time of her death a bona fide resident of Creek County, State of Oklahoma, leaving as her sole and surviving heirs at law the said Dave Bruner a son, and the said Josie Bruner, a son, now deceased; that the said Josie Bruner died in infance, unmarried, without issue, intestate, near the town of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, on or about the 2nd day of July, 1900, being at the time of his death a bona fide resident of Creek County, State of Oklahoma, and as his sole and only surviving heir at law the said Dave Bruner, the petitioner herein, that the county court of Creek County, State of Oklahoma, has jurisdiction to approve a deed made and executed by the heir or heirs of the said Sarah Holden, deceased, the allottee of said land hereinafar described.

That there was allotted to the said Sarah Holden as her proportionate allotment of lands of the Creek Nation in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

"
