RIGHT OF WAY AGREEMENT.

For and in consideration of the sum of Ten & 45/100 (\$10.45)-Dollars, to him in hand paid by F.Weidner, Supt., The RECEIPT OF WHICH IS HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGED, J.J. Cornelson does hereby grant to The Tulsa Fuel & Manufacturing Company, its successors or grantees, the right of way to lay, maintain, operate, relay and remove a pipe line for the transportation of gas, with the right of ingress and egress thereto, said right of way being more fully described by definite plat of location attached, situated in the County of Tulsa, and State of Oklahoma, and on, over, and through the following described land;

The NWL of NEL of Section 11, Township 21 North, Range 13 East of the Indian Base and Meridian, containing 40 acres, more or less.

The said grantor, his heirs or grantees, and the public are to fully use and enjoy the said premises, except the easement hereinbefore granted.

The mid The Tulsa Fuel & Manufacturing Company for itself and its successors or grantees hereby covenants to bury its line of pipe so that the same will not interfere with the use of the premises as aforesaid;

It is further agreed that The Tulsa Fuel & Manufacturing Company, its successors or grantees shall have the right to change the size of its said line of pipe, the damage, if any to crops and surface by reason of such change to be paid by the said grantee, its successors or grantees.

The damage for and because of the laying of the first line of pipe is included in the above payment. All damage thereafter to fences, crops and premises which may be suffered by reason of the maintenance, operations of alterations of said line of pipe, if not mutually agreed upon, to be ascertained and determined by three disinterested persons, one to be chosen by the owner of the premises, one by The Tulsa Fuel & Manufacturing Company, its successors or grantees, and the third by the two chosen as aforesaid, and the award of any two of such three persons shall be final and conclusive.
