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227190-GE ALLOTMENT DEED. KE 37041 CHEROKEE NEW BORN THE CHEROKEE NATION, (FORMERLY INDIAN TERRITORY)

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TO ALL TO WHOM THESE FRESN TS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, By the Act of Congress approved July 1; 1902, (32 Stat. 716), ratified by the Cherokee Mation August 7, 1902, it is provided that there shall be allotted by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, to each citizen of the Cherokee Tribe, land equal in value to one hundred and ten acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, and,

WHEREAS, It was provided by said Act of Congress that each citizen shall designate or have designated and selected for him, at the time of his selection of allotment, out of his allotment, as a homestead, land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, as nearly as may be, for which he shall receive a separate certificate, and,

WHEREAS, The s aid Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, or its lawful successor, has certified that the land hardinafter described has been selected by or on behalf of Margarett a Deal, a citizen of said Tribe, as an allotment, exclusive of land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, selected as a homestead as aforesaid,

NOW? THEREFORE, 1, the undersigned, Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said Margarett A. Deal, all right, title and interest of theCherokee Nation, and of all other citizens of said Nation, in and to the following described land, viz:

> The South West Quarter of the North West Quarter of the South East Quarter, of Section Thirty(30) Township Sixteen (16) North, Range Twanty-four (24) East, and Lot Four (4), and the North East Quarter of the South West Quarter of the North West Quarter of Section Four (4), Township Twenty-Two (22) North Range Fourteen (14) East.

of the Indian Base and Meridian, in Oklahoma, containing Fifty-nine and 99/100 (59.99) acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States survey thereof, subject, however, to all the provisions of said Act of Congress.

IN WITNESS WHERBOF, I, the Frincipal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said Nation to be affixed this 9th, day of July A. J. 1912. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR WASHINGTON, D. C. Sept. 27, 1912.

Pursuant to the acts of July 1, 1902, (32 Stat., 716), and April 26, 1908, (34 Stat., 137) the within deed conveying the land therein described to Margarett A Deal, whose name appears opposite No. 1428, on the approved rolls of new born citizens as a ONE-SIXTEENTH BLOOM CHEROKEE is hereby approved, subject to all laws relating to the LEAS-ING JAXATION, and ALIENATION of said land.
