ORDINANCE NO. 1831.

An Ordinance vacating certain portions of Detroit Avenue between Fourteenth  
and Fifteenth Streets, and certain portions of Eighteenth Street between Carson Avenue  
and the east line of the Park and Boulevard right of way, all in the City of Tulsa,  
Oklahoma; and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, a certain petition, in writing, signed by persons owning real estate  
situated on each side of DETROIT Avenue between Fourteenth Street and Fifteenth Street  
has been presented to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, asking that certain por-  
tions of said Detroit Avenue, hereinafter described, be vacated; and

WHEREAS, a certain written petition has been filed with said Mayor and Board  
of Commissioners, asking that certain portions of Eighteenth Street, between the West  
line of Carson Avenue and the east line of the right of way for the park and boulevard  
system of the City of Tulsa, be also vacated, and

WHEREAS, it appears upon examination by said Board that the said portions of  
said avenue and said street are not necessary for the uses of the public as portions of  
said avenue and of said street respectively.
