This indenture, made this 31st day of January, 1924, by and between Sand Springs Home a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Oklahoma, party of the first part, and Sand Springs Power, Light and Water Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Oklahoma party of the second part, witnesseth:

That for and in consideration of one dollar and other good and valuable considerations paid by party of the second part to the party of the first part, receipt whereof is by the party of the first part hereby acknowledged, the said party of the first part has granted, bargained, sold, conveyed, transferred, assigned and set over to, and by these presents does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey, transfer, assign and set over to the said party of the second part, its successor and assigns, all the following described goods, chattels, lands and tenements situate in Tulsa and Osage Counties, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

All of the electric high lines and transmission lines whereby electric current is conveyed to various cities and towns in said counties, and all of the electric distributing system owned by party of the first part in various cities and towns in said counties, including all poles, wires, generators, meters, transformers, conduits, fixtures, machinery, equipment, and appliances of every kind and nature in every manner used for transmission of electric current or connected in any way therewith now owned by party of the first part in and connecting the cities and towns of Sand Springs, Tulsa, Turley, Skiatook, Sperry, Avant, Barnsdale, (formerly Bighart) Pershing, Pawhuska, Shidler, Osage and Wynona, also all franchises owned in said towns, and other cities and towns on Oklahoma.

Also all the lands and tenements, right-of-ways, easements, grants, rights and privileges, appurtenances in any manner connected with or pertaining to said transmission lines and distributing systems owned by party of the first part in said counties,

Also all of the high lines and transmission lines, aforesaid, owned by party of the first part in said counties and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

- Line No. 1. - Sand Springs to Tulsa, 6.4 miles 6600 volts, 36 poles, 40 to 50 ft, long per mile, four pin cross arms, three No. 1 copper wires.
- Line No. 2, Sand Springs, to Tulsa, 5 1/2 miles, 13200 volts, 36-30 ft. poles per mile, four pin cross arms, three No. 1 copper wires;
- Line No. 3 - Sand Springs to Tulsa 9.2 miles, 33,000 volts, 36-30 ft, poles per mile, 53 in. bow arm fixtures, three No. 1 copper wires;
- Line No. 4, Sand Springs, to Tulsa, 7.4 miles, 33000 volts, 3-4 ft. poles per mile, 36 bow arm fixtures, three 2/0 aluminum wires;
- Line No. 5. Tulsa to Skiatook, 17.3 miles, 33,000 volts, 3-30 to 35 ft. poles per mile, 52 in bow arm fixtures, three No. 3, copper wires;
- Line No. 6, Skiatook to Pawhuska, 36.2 miles, 33,000 volts, 26-35 ft poles per miles, 52 in. bow arm fixtures, three 1/0 aluminum wires.
- Line No. 7, Sand Springs to Pawhuska, Okla. via Hominy, 48.3 miles, 33,000 volts, 26.35 ft. poles per mile 52 in bow arm fixtures, three 2/0 aluminum wires.
