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That for and in consideration of one dollar and other good and valuable considerstions paid by partyof the second part to the party of the first part, receipt whereof is by the party of the firstpart herebyacknowledged, the saidparty of the first part has granted, bergained, sold, conveyed, transferred, assigned and set over to, and by these presents does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey, transfer, assign an set over to the said party of the second part, its successor and assigns, all the following described goods, chattels, lands and tenements situate in Tulsa and Osage Counties, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:
