To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:

Whereas, by the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902, (32 Stat. 716) ratified by the Cherokee Nation, August 7, 1902, it was provided that there should be allotted by the Commissible to the Five Civilized Tribes, to each citizen of the Cherokee Nation, land equal in value to one hundred andten acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, and.

Whereas, it was provided by said Act of Congress, that each member of said tribe shall, at the time of the selection of his allotment, designate, or have selected and designated for him from his allotment, land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, as nearly as may be, as a haddestead, for which separate certificate shell issue; and,

Whereas, the said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, for its lawful su cessor has certified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by or m bahalf of Clifford W. King, a citizen of said tribe, as a homsetbad.
