

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents, do grant and convey unto the said Clifford W. King, all right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, and of all other citizens of said Nation, in and to the following described land, viz: The north east quarter of the north east quarter ^{of the Southwest quarter} and the west half of the north west quarter of the south east quarter of section thirty two (32) township twenty two (22) north, range fourteen (14) east, of the Indian Base and Meridian, in Oklahoma, containing thirty (30) acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States survey thereof, subject, however, to the conditions provided by said Act of Congress pertaining to allotted homestead.

In witness whereof, I, the principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said Nation to be affixed this 12th day of Feb. A.D. 1913.

Pursuant to the acts of July 1, 1902 (32 Stat. 716) and April 26, 1906 (34 Stat. 137) the within deed conveying the land therein described to Clifford W. King, whose name appears opposite No. 2887 on the approved rolls of new-born citizens as a one sixteenth blood Cherokee, is hereby approved, subject to all laws relating to the leasing, taxation and alienation of said land.

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AFIDAVIT.

County of Tulsa) SS Mac W. Rupp, first being duly sworn upon oath deposes and says that he is a resident of the city of Tulsa, in the State of Oklahoma and of legal age.

Affiant further states that under date of April 14th, 1920, a mortgage was executed by G. J. Huete, and Genevieve Huete, his wife, in the amount of \$150.00 and made in favor of Mac W. Rupp, and Gordon Grady, and covering the following described real estate: The south half of lot two block six Pleasant View addition to the City of Tulsa, Okla. according to the recorded plat thereof.

Affiant further states that under date of January 12th, 1923, the above mentioned mortgage was paid in full but Gordon Grady, had left these parts and could not at this time be located.

Affiant further states that under date of January 12th, 1923, he executed a release of the above mentioned mortgage and signed same as Mac W. Rupp and Gordon Grady, by Mac W. Rupp.
