I, Edward M. Cowhey, of Tulsa, Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, being now of strong mind and fully sensible of all that I shall do and also sensible of the uncertainty of life and desiring to make disposition of my property and affairs, while in health and strength, so hereby make, public and declare the following to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking and canceling all other or former wills by me at any time made.

First: I direct that my executrix hereinafter named pay or caused to be paid all my just debts and funeral expenses as soon as may be after my death.

Second: I give, devise and bequeath unto my dear mother, Mrs. Margaret Cowhey, now residing in St. Louis, Missouri, the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3000.00) to be paid by my executrix out of the proceeds of a ^{policy of} life insurance payable to my estate in said sum of three thousand dollars, said bequest to be paid as soon as the policy of life insurance shall be paid to my said estate.

Third: I give and bequeath unto my sister, Miss Agnes Cowhey, the sum of two thousand (\$2000.00) to be paid out of my estate by my executrix as soon as the same may be conveniently paid therefrom.

Fourth: I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Martha V. Cowhey, all the rest and residue of my property of whatsoever kind or character or wherever situate, either real, personal or mixed, including my interest in the corporation, Tulsa Oil Products Company, my residence situate at 1536 South Peoria Street, Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and all of the household furniture therein, and my automobile and all personal, effects or or property whatsoever.

Fifth: If either my sister or mother should die before my death, then in that event the bequest herein above provided shall revert to my estate and become a part of the residue thereof.

Sixth: I hereby appoint and designate my wife, Martha V. Cowhey, sole administratrix without bond of this my last will and testament.
