twenty five per cent of all the money actually collected to the date of forefeiture, which shall be full payent and complete satisfaction for their efforts in attempting to sell game.

It is further understood between theparties hereto, that in the event first pary sells or transfers its interest in this agreement, then in that evet, the balance unpaid shall become due and payable to second party, and this instrument may be contrued as a mortgage and may be foreslowd as such.

This agreement sall be binding uponthe parties hereto, their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns.
