

3. No one shall dig graves, not even in a family lot, but the sexton and his assistant forwhich services three dollars shall be paid, by the party.

4. No lot shall accommodate more than 10 full graves; an exception to be made in the four large lots surrounding the mound, and in case of the burial of children under ten years of age.

5. No tombstone, family or single, shall be set without a proper concrete foundation; and under the direction of the engineer as to line and grade.

6. Anyone violating the above rules, or driving on the lots and parkage shall be subject to a fine assessed by the trustees of the Parish.

7. Block seven (7) shall be and is set apart for strangers and such as are not of this Parish, unless such parties shall select and acquire the title to any other block at their choice.
