

Quit-Claims &c.

Know all men by these presents: That for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred seven & five dollars, and other valuable considerations in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, we, Joe Miller and husband, William Miller of Checotah, Oklahoma, do hereby quit claims, release and convey to Chas. B. Ewing, a corporation, organized under the laws in force in the Indian Territory and abiding business in the state of Oklahoma by having complied with the laws of the state, the following land formerly being and lying in the Creek Nation of the Indian Territory and now being and lying in the County of Tucker, state of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The southwest quarter of the southwest quarter, of section 36, township 36 north, range 7 east, containing 64 acres, and being the homestead allotment of Elyah Cordy deceased, and also the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section 36, and the northwest quarter of section 36, all in township 36 north, range 7 east, being the surplus allotment of said Elyah Cordy deceased, the said lands having been allotted to Elyah Cordy deceased, and duly enrolled citizen of the Creek Nation and patented to the heirs of said Elyah Cordy by patent executed by the Principal Chief of the Muskogee Nation on March 26, 1904, and duly approved by Ethan A. Hitchcock, Secretary of the Interior, on April 25, 1904.

We have and to hold the said described premises unto the said grantee, its heirs, and assigns forever.
