

United States Court for the Indian Territory in the
 Western District thereof.
 In the matter of the Guardianship of
 Florence Rock, Minor, Native Rock Guardians.
 On the 12th day of October, A.D. 1907, the same being
 one of the days of the regular October term of the Court, sit-
 ting at Tulsa, in Oklahoma, came on for consideration the
 report of the guardian filed herein, transmitting to the Court
 an bill and the running lease, situated in Guadalupe, by
 Dupre Rock, as guardian of the person and estate of Florence
 Rock, a minor, to the Tulsa Travel Company, a corporation
 on the foregoing described lease, of the word, being set-
 tled in the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, to wit:
 NE 1/4 of Sec 16, Twp 24 N, R. 24 E, Sec 22 Township
 20 North, Range 13 East, containing 39 acres more or less.
 And now come the Honorable E. H. Catterworth, Probate Com-
 missioner, who also in report recommending the approval of
 said lease, which report is examined and approved, and the Court
 being fully advised in the premises, finds that the said Guardian
 has complied in each and every respect and every detail with
 the order of the Court heretofore made on the 25th day of June,
 1907, and that said Guardian duly executed the hearing of
 said lease, by publishing notice, as required by the order
 of said Court, in the Tulsa Daily World, of Tulsa, Ok., for two
 successive weeks, the first publication being on the 11th day of
 September, 1907, and the last publication being on the 18th day of
 September, 1907, and by further publishing like notice in
 the Muskogee Phoenix, in the City of Muskogee, Ok., and the
 said publication appearing on the date as above set forth; that
 the Probate Commissioner duly distributed printed bills
 concerning said notice with in three days after the first
 publication, to the United States Indian Agent at Muskogee,
 Ok., to the Commissioners to the Two Brigades Tribes, at
 Muskogee, Ok., and to the Agents Clerk in each of the
 Court towns in the Western District of the Indian Territory.
 The Court further finds that the same were duly ad-
 vanced to said notice and that the highest bid offered
 therefor was one dollar and one cent, provided
 for the payment to the said Guardian of a bonus of \$6.00.
