In the matter of the Guardianship of
Lillie Roach, minor, Tuxie Roach, Guardian.

On this 12th day of October, A.D. 1907, the same being one of the days of the regular October term of this Court, sitting at Tulsa, in Probate, comes on for consideration the report of the Guardian filed herein, transmitting to the Court an Oil and Gas mining lease, executed in quadruplicate, by Tuxie Roach as Guardian of the person and estate of Lillie Roach, a minor, to the Pioneer Oil Company, a corporation on the following described land, of the ward, lying and being situated in the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, to-wit:-

SE^{1/4} of NE^{1/4} of NE^{1/4}; and NW^{1/4} of NE^{1/4} of NE^{1/4}; and NW^{1/4} of NW^{1/4} of NE^{1/4} of Section 15 Township 20 North, Range 13 East containing 40 acres, more or less.

And now comes the Honorable C. H. Butterworth, Probate Commissioner, and files his report recommending the approval of said lease, which report is examined and approved, and the Court being fully advised in the premises, finds that the said Guardian has complied in each and every respect and every detail with the order of this Court heretofore made on the 25th day of June, 1907, and that said Guardian duly advertised the leasing of said lands, by publishing notices, as required by the order of said Court, in the Tulsa Daily World, of Tulsa, IT, for two successive weeks, the first publication being on the 11th day of September, 1907, and the last publication being on the 18th day of September, 1907, and by further publishing like notices in the Muskogee Phoenix, in the City of Muskogee, IT; and the said publication appearing on the dates as above set forth; that the Probate Commissioner duly distributed printed slips concerning such notice with in three days after the first publication, to the United States Indian Agent, at Muskogee, IT, to the Commissioner to the Five Civilized Tribes, at Muskogee, IT, and to the Deputy Clerk in each of the Court towns in Western District of the Indian Territory.

The Court further finds that bids were duly received,
