Probate Court, Tulsa County, Oklahoma.

November Term, 11th day of Nov. 1908.

In reapplication for approval of Oil and Gas Mining Lease from the heirs of Emanuel Bruner to W. J. Springer and E. R. Minshall.

The application of W. J. Springer and E. R. Minshall to have approved by this court the oil and gas mining lease on Lots Two (2) Three (3) and Four (4) in section 5, Township 19 North, Range 12 East, and Lot Two (2) and the south east quarter of the northeast quarter, and the East Half of the south west quarter of the north east quarter, and the East Half of the West Half of the south west quarter of the north east quarter of section 6, Township 19, North Range 12 East of the Indian Meridian executed, acknowledged, and delivered in quadruplicate on the 7th day of August, 1908, by William G. Bruner and Jennie Bruner, as sole heirs of Emanuel Bruner, the same having been acknowledged by William G. Bruner and Jennie Bruner before Dessie L. Swift, a Notary Public for Tulsa County, Oklahoma and so certified, to by her and executed, in the presence of and witnessed by Guy L. Reed and Dessie L. Swift, came up for hearing on this the 11th day of Nov. 1908 at the regular November term of the Probate Court for Tulsa County, Oklahoma and from the allegations of said application and the testimony of witnesses examined and heard in open court the Court is of opinion and finds that said lease was freely and voluntarily executed, acknowledged and delivered by the said grantors and as their free and voluntarily act and deed; and that the terms and royalty paid and stipulated for therein are fair and reasonable, and that said lease is in the usual and customary form, and contains the usual and customary provisions of oil and gas mining leases in
