To collect all rents and benefits accruing therefrom. To exercise a general supervision thereover, and to take full possession thereof at any time I might otherwise take such possession myself, giving my said attorney full power to do every thing whatsoever requisite and necessary to be done in the premises as fully as I could do if personally present, with full power of substitution and revocation, hereby ratifying and confirming all that my said attorney, or his substitute, shall lawfully do, or cause to be done by virtue hereof.
