Order Conflicting Lease

The case coming on in the order to be heard, and the Court being fully advised in the premises, and it appearing to the Court that Milton Bayland is citizen of the Creek Nation, and as such has had allotted to him one new section for a full the following described land, to-wit: The South half (S $\frac{1}{2}$) of the South east quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) and West half (W $\frac{1}{2}$) of the northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of section Twenty seven (27), Township nineteen (19), Range eleven (11), situated in the Creek Nation, State of Oklahoma.

And it further appearing that said Milton Bayland is the only person interested in said land and it further appearing that it is for the best interests of said minor to have said above described land developed for oil and gas in order that funds may be obtained for the proper education, maintenance and support of said minor, and it further appearing that the estate of said minor is not financially able to develop said land for oil and gas and it further appearing that under the order of this Court heretofore made the issue of said Douglas Benjamin has referred to the Red Rock of Tulsa, Oklahoma, an oil and gas mining lease on the above described land of said Milton Bayland, and it further appearing that said the Red Rock has paid therefor as bonus the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, and it further appearing that said lease is a good and sufficient bond for said oil and gas mining lease and is as much as could be obtained therefor and it further appearing that said Douglas Benjamin and Milton Bayland are both residents of Muskogee County, State of Oklahoma.
