And now on this 12th day of November, 1921, it being one of the regular probate days of the October, 1921, term of this court, comes Vera Ida Stout, administratrix, of the estate of G. D. Stout, deceased, and by her attorney, F. O. Cavitt, presents the final report of her acts and doings in said estate and asks for an order of distribution and final settlement of her account of said estate to the heirs at law of said deceased, and it appearing to the court that due and legal notice has been given to creditors of said estate; that no claims have been filed against said estate, and that, the time has lapsed for claims to be filed against said estate, and it further appearing to the court that all the costs of administration of said estate have been fully paid; that there is no taxes due and unpaid to the county or state; that due and legal notice has been given of the hearing of said final report and same is now on file in this probate; that said administratrix has in all things managed and conducted said estate according to law and the orders of this court.

And it doth further appear from the final report of said administratrix that there is now in her hands the sum of \$630.61 to be distributed to the heirs at law of said deceased, subject to an order of distribution of this court.

And it doth further appear from the files in this probate, and from the proof submitted this day, that said G. D. Stout died at Tulsa, Oklahoma, on or about the 4th day of February, 1921, leaving surviving him as his sole and only heir at law the following named persons, to-wit:

Vera Ida Stout, wife, of Tulsa, Oklahoma,

Ulara Stout, daughter, of Tulsa Oklahoma,

that by virtue of the laws of succession of the State of Oklahoma, each of said above named heirs at law, are entitled to one-half of said estate, or in the amounts, to-wit:

Vera Ida Stout, the sum of \$315.30; and Ulara Stout, the sum of \$315.31 and this day allowed to Vera Ida Stout, for support of Clara Stout.

It is, therefore, ordered by the court that said administratrix, Vera Ida Stout, pay out of the residue, of said estate, the said last above named sums to the heirs of said deceased, as above set forth in this order.
