Now on this the 9th day of May 1923, same being one of the days set apart by order of this court for the hearing of matters pertaining to the affairs of restricted, members of the Five Civilized Tribes of Indians, came on to be heard the petition of the above named Mildred Childers, filed herein upon the 2nd day of May 1923, praying for the approval of her certain warranty deed dated May 1st, 1923, wherein and whereby she joined by her husband Daniel B. Childers conveyed unto E. A. Ross an undivided one-sixth interest, same being all her right, title and interest in and to the following described land, situated in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit,

South-west Quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section One, township

Eighteen North, Range Twelve East, containing Forty acres more or less.

at and for the consideration of Eighteen Hundred Dollars in cash; and the said Mildred Childers having personally appeared in court and testified and the court having heard the evidence and being fully advised, finds the allegations of said petition to be true; that Roley McIntosh was a duly and legally enrolled member of the Creek Tribe of Indians and as such received the above land during his life time as a part of his allotment to which he was entitled as a member of said tribe; that he died, intestate, at his permanent home in McIntosh County, State of Oklahoma, upon the 30th day of November 1908; that he left surviving him as his sole and only heirs at law, Ellen McIntosh, his widow and the following named children, Bunnie McIntosh, John McIntosh, Thomas McIntosh and the above named Mildred McIntosh Childers.

That the said Mildred Childers is a full blood, adult, enrolled member of the Creek Tribe of Indians, enrolled opposite roll number 2709 of the approved rolls of said tribe; that the consideration set forth in the above described deed is adequate.

IT IS THEREFORE ordered and decreed that the above and foregoing described deed of conveyance be and the same is hereby in all things approved.
