ORDER APPROVING DEED OF FULL BLOOD INDIAN HEIR
TO INHERITED LAND.

NOW, this 21st day of June, 1923, a petition of Chas. Page for an order approving a certain Warranty Deed executed by Anna T. Adams conveying all her right, title, interest and estate in and to the following described real estate and premises, situate in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The South half of the South east quarter and the Northeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section Two, township 19, North, Range 11, East, situate in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, said deed being executed by her, the said Anna T. Adams, as grantor, to Ethel Davis, as grantee, on the 21st day of February, 1911.

Came regularly on for hearing.

The petitioner, Chas. Page, appeared by his attorneys, Stuart, Cruce & Bland and Paul P. Pinkerton, and it satisfactory appearing to the Court that Hon. Peter Deichman, the United States Probate attorney in this jurisdiction, had been duly notified of the filing of said petition, and of the time and place of hearing same, and all parties announced ready for trial.

And, the court having examined the verified petition filed herein and having heard all the evidence adduced in support of said petition, and the testimony witnesses duly sworn and testifying in open court, and having heard the arguments and remarks of counsel, and being well and fully advised in the premises, find that Samuel Adams was a full-blood citizen of the Muskogee or Creek Tribe of Indians, duly enrolled upon the final citizenship rolls of said nation, opposite roll No. 6957, that, as such citizen of said Creek nation there was allotted to the said Samuel Adams by the commission to the Five Civilized Tribes the real estate and premises hereinbefore described; that, said Samuel Adams died intestate in Creek County in the State of Oklahoma on or about the 13th day of February, A.D., 1911, and left

surviving him as his sole and only heirs at law, Anna T. Adams, who was his lawful wife, and a full-blood citizen of the Creek nation, enrolled upon the final approved rolls of said nation, opposite roll No. 5424, and Jim Adams, the infant son of said Samuel Adams and said Anna T. Adams, and that the said Jim Adams died on the 19th day of February, 1911, in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma.
