### COMPARED

WHEREAS, a petition signed by all of the property owners owning property in Block 13, of Broadmoor Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, has been presented to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, asking that the alley therein described, to-wit: the alley running North and South through Block 13 from Fourteenth Place to Fifteenth Street, be vacated and abandoned as public Alley.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA: SECTION 1, That the alley running North and South in Block 13 of Broadmoor Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, from Fourteenth Place to Fifteenth Street, according to the official plat thereof, be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned as a public alley of said City.

SECTION: 2 Provided however, that the City of Tulsa hereby reserves and shall retain forever, the right to construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers and other appurtenances thereto appertaining, now located in said alley of which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said alley with the right of ingress and egress over and through said premises above indicated and for said purposes four (4) feet on each side of the center line of said alley is hereby maintained by the City of Tulsa, upon which said City of Tulsa May allow public service corporations, companies, individuals or itself to construct maintain and operate facilities for public utilities, including poles, wires, pipes, conduits and other necessary accessories; and,

PROVIDED, FURTHER, that four (4) feet on each side of the center, line of said alley shall be construed to mean sufficient space near the center of said alley for the purposes above specified and provided further, that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of Paragraph 11 of Section 6, of Article 11 of the Charter of the City of Tulsa,

SECTION 3: That all ordinance of parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance insofar as such conflicts exists, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: That an emergency exists for the preservation of <sup>the</sup> public welfare and safety, by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

PASSED, and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved this 20th, day of April 1923,
