WHEREAS, a petition signed by the Board of Education, who is the owner of abutting property on the streets herein mentioned has been presented to the MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the City of Tulsa, OKLAHOMA, asking that the street therein described be vacated and abandoned as a public street.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THIS BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TULSA OKLAHOMA:

SECTIONI, That that postion of TROOST AVENUE just south of TWEEFTH STREET between, blocks three and four, McNulty Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, be and the same is her by vacated and abandoned as a public street of said City. Provided however that the City of Tulsa hereby reserves and shall retain forever, the right to construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers and other appurtenances thereto appertaining now located in said street or which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said street with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purposes above indicated, over and upon that portion of the above described street and said strip of land is hereby maintained by the City of Tulsa, upon which said City of Tulsa, may allow public service corporations, companies, individuals or itself to construct, maintain and operate facilities for public utilities and including poles, wires, pipes, conduits, and other necessary accessories, and,

Provided, further that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of Paragraph 11, of Section 6, of Article 11 of the Charter of the Uity of Tulsa.

SECTION 2: That all ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance insofar as such conflict exists are herebyrepealed.

SECTION 3: That an emergence exists for the preservations of the public welfare and safety by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect, from and after its passage approval and publication.

PASSED, and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved, this 20th, day of April 1923.
