RESOLUTION.

COMPARED

A resolution disclaiming easement rights on and over the north 57 feet on what was formerly the alley running north and south in Block 5, Southside addition to the City of Tulsa and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, it appears on March 23rd, 1917, by and through the passage of ordinance 1662, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, vacated the alley running north and south in Block 5, Southside addition to the City of Tulsa, Tulsa, County Oklahoma, and reserved certain easement rights to build, maintain and repair sanitary sewers, and to permit lines to be constructed, maintained and repaired of Public utilities and Public corporations, and

Whereas, it further appears that it is unnecessary that said rights be retained in so far as the north 57 feet of the alley running north and south in said block vacated by said ordinances, if concerned, and that said easement rights should be disclaimed.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, Okla.

Section 1. That the City of Tulsa hereby disclaims the easement rights reserved to it over and through what was formerly the alley running north and south in block 5, Southside addition, to the City of Tulsa, vacated by ordinance No. 1662, in so far as the north 57 feet of said alley is concerned.

Section 2. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety, by reason thereof this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.

Passed, and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved, this 27th day of April, 1923.
