Ordinance No. 1662.

An ordinance vacating both of the alleys in Block 5, of South Side addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, with certain reservations, and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, the owners of the real estate adjacent to both of the alleys herein described have petitioned this Board in writing to vacate the same.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Section 1. That the alley running east and west in Block 5 and also the alley running north and south in said Block 5 in south side addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, be and the same are hereby vacated and abandoned as public alleys of said city.

Provided, however, that the City of Tulsa hereby reserves and shall retain forever the right to construct, reconstruct, repair maintain and operate sanitary sewers and other appurtenances thereto appertaining now located in said alleys, or which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said alleys, with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purposes above indicated, and for said purposes the center lines of said alleys are hereby maintained by the City of Tulsa, upon which lines the city of Tulsa may allow public service corporations, companies, individuals or itself to construct, maintain and operate facilities for public utilities, including poles, wires, pipes, conduits and other necessary accessories; and,

Provided, further that the center lines of said alleys shall be construed to mean sufficient space near the center of said alleys for the purposes above specified; and
