WITNESSETH, The said part is of the first part, in consideration of the sum of
seventeen hundred and ~~and~~ no DOLLARS,
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said
 party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the
 County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

One part of lots seven (7) block one hundred forty-one (104),
 having a frontage of five (5) feet on main street and extending in
 a westerly direction parallel with south third street to a depth of
 seventy-five (75) feet, more particularly described as follows: Beginning
 on the easterly line of block one hundred four (104) at a point fifty
 (50) feet in a northerly direction from the southeast corner of
 said block, thence seventy-five (75) feet in a westerly direction
 parallel with south third street, thence five (5) feet in a northerly
 direction parallel with main street, thence twenty-five (25) feet
 in an easterly direction to the easterly line of said block one
 hundred four (104); thence five (5) feet along said line in a
 southerly direction to place of beginning above named land
 located in the city of Tulsa according to the official plat of the
 original town thereof.

 heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said part is of the

 granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unincum-
 bered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what
 nature and kind soever; ~~except assessment to subseq[ue]nt to 1907 ad valorem~~
 and that they will warrant, and forever defend the title to the same unto said part is of the second part their
 heirs and assigns, against said part is of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomso-
 ever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
