One (\$1.00)and — DOLLARS,the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, lawfully quitclaim, do hereby these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said part of the second part, and his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:This northerly three and one half (3 1/2) feet of lot four (4), and the southerly seventeen (17) feet of lot five (5), all in block one hundred five (105) in the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma (formerly Indian Territory), according to the official plat and survey thereof.These said releasing unto second party all the right, title and interest that the grantor herein might have in the above described property by virtue of a contract between the parties hereto, dated the 20th day of March, 1907, recorded in book 1209 page 369 of the records of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, except that portion of the contract referring to a party wall, which portion of said contract is hereby specifically excepted from the intent of this instrument.TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME, Together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever, To have and to hold the above granted premises unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever.And said heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said part of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents lawfully seized in own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unincumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever;and that will warrant, and forever defend the title to the same unto said part of the second part heirs and assigns, against said part of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.IN WITNESS WHEREOF, The said part of the first part has hereunto set his hand the day and year first above written.
