AGREEMENT, Made and entered into the 21 day of January 1924 by and between George W. Slope, guardian for Everett E. Slope, minor of E. E. Howard party of the first part, hereinafter called lessor (whether one or more) and party of the second part, lessee.

WITNESSETH, That the said lessor, for and in consideration of One (\$1.00) DOLLARS, cash in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and of the covenants and agreements hereinafter contained on the part of lessee to be paid, kept and performed, has granted, demised, leased and let and by these presents do grant, demise, lease and let unto the said lessee, for the sole and only purpose of mining and operating for oil and gas, and of laying of pipe lines, and building tanks, powers, stations and structures thereon to produce, save, and take care of said products, all that certain tract of land, situate in the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, described as follows to-wit:

The North Half (N $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the Southwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Nineteen (19) Township Twenty-one North, (21) Range Fourteen East (14)

of section 19 Township 21 N. Range 14 E. and containing eighty acres, more or less.

It is agreed that this lease shall remain in force for a term of Five years from this date, and as long thereafter as oil or gas, or either of them is produced from said land by the lessee.

In consideration of the premises the said lessee covenants and agrees:

1st. To deliver to the credit of lessor, free of cost, in the pipe line to which he may connect his wells, the equal one-eighth part of all oil produced and saved from the leased premises.

2nd. To pay lessor One Eighth Royalty Prevailing Market Rate Dollars each year, in advance, for the gas from each well where gas only is found, while the same is being used off the premises, and if used in the manufacture of gasoline or any other product, a royalty of one-eighth (1/8), payable monthly at the prevailing market rate; and lessor to have gas free of cost from any such well for all stoves and all inside lights in the principal dwelling house on said land during the same time by making his own connections with the well at his own risk and expense.

3rd. To pay lessor for gas produced from any oil well and used off the premises or in the manufacture of gasoline or any other product at the rate of one eighth royalty per year for the time during which such gas shall be used, payable one eighth royalty or a royalty of one-eighth (1/8) payable monthly at the prevailing market rate.

from date of approval by County Judge

If no well be commenced on said land on or before the 30 days day of 19, the lease shall terminate

as to both parties, unless the lessee on or before that date shall pay or tender to the lessor, or the lessor's credit in the Owasso State

Bank at Owasso, Oklahoma, or its successors, which shall continue as the depository regardless of changes in the ownership

of said land, the sum of Eighty (\$80.00) DOLLARS, which shall operate as a rental and cover the privileges of deferring

the commencement of a well for 30 days month from said date. In like manner and upon like payments or tenders the commencement of a well

may be further deferred for like period of the same number of months successively. And it is understood and agreed that the consideration first recited herein,

the down payment, covers not only the privileges granted to the date when said first rental is payable as aforesaid, but also the lessee's option of extending that

period as aforesaid, and any and all other rights conferred.

Should the first well drilled on the above described land be a dry hole, then, and in that event, if a second well is not commenced on said land within

twelve months from the expiration of the last rental period for which rental has been paid, this lease shall terminate as to both parties, unless the lessee on or

before the expiration of said twelve months shall resume the payment of rentals in the same amount and in the same manner as hereinbefore provided. And

it is agreed that upon the resumption of the payment of rentals, as above provided, that the last preceding paragraph hereof, governing the payment of rentals

and the effect thereof, shall continue in force just as though there had been no interruption in the rental payments.

If said lessor owns a less interest in the above described land than the entire and undivided fee simple estate therein, then the royalties and rentals herein

provided for shall be paid the lessor or only in the proportion which his interest bears to the whole and undivided fee.

Lessee shall have the right to use free of cost, gas, oil and water produced on said land for his operations thereon, except water from well of

lessor.

When requested by lessor, lessee shall bury his pipe lines below plow depth.

No well shall be drilled nearer than 200 feet to the house or barn now on said premises, without the written consent of the lessor.

Lessee shall pay for damages caused by his operations to growing crops on said land.

Lessee shall have the right at any time to remove all machinery and fixtures placed on said premises, including the right to draw and remove casing.

If the estate of either party hereto is assigned, and the privilege of assigning in whole or in part is expressly allowed—the covenants hereof shall extend

to their heirs, executors, administrators, successors or assigns, but no change in the ownership of the land or assignment of rentals or royalties shall be binding

on the lessee until after the lessee has been furnished with a written transfer or assignment or a true copy thereof; and it is hereby agreed in the event this lease

shall be assigned as to a part or parts of the above described lands and the assignee or assignees of such part or parts shall fail or make default in the payment

of the proportionate part of the rents due from him or them, such default shall not operate to defeat or affect this lease in so far as it covers a part or parts of

said lands which the said lessee or any assignee thereof shall make due payment of said rental.

Lessor hereby warrants and agrees to defend the title to the lands herein described, and agrees that the lessee shall have the right at any time to redeem

for lessor, by payment, any mortgages, taxes or other liens on the above described lands, in the event of default of payment by lessor, and be subrogated to

the rights of the holder thereof. It is understood that if no well be started on this lease within thirty

days (30), from date of approval of same by County Judge of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, that

same shall be null and void unless the lessee pays to the Owasso State Bank the sum of

Eighty Dollars which shall extend the term of this lease thirty days from date due, and

if a well has not been started by the time this thirty days is up this lease shall become

null and void.
