WARRANTY DEED RECORD No. 466

This Indenture, Made this 22nd day of September, A. D. 1923, between

Harry T. Shipman, a single man,

of Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, party of the first part, and

William T. Dickson and Nellie Dickson, husband and wife,

party of the second part.

Witnesseth: That in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other valuable considerations

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, said party of the first part do hereby presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said parties of the second part, their heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

A strip of land 42 feet 7 inches in width from North to South and extending from East to West entirely across Lot One, Block One Hundred Forty Two of the original Townsite of Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and adjoining and lying South of a line drawn from a point 66.96 feet South of the North-east corner of said lot to a point on the Westerly boundary line of said Lot 8.35 feet Southerly from the North-west corner of said lot of the original Townsite of Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, since April 26th, 1913 at 10:30 A.M.

And said Harry T. Shipman, a single man, his

heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said parties of the second part that at the delivery of these presents that he is lawfully seized in his own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance in fee simple, of and in all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear and discharged and unincumbered of and from all former and other grants, titles, charges, estates, judgment taxes and assessments and incumbrances of whatsoever nature and kind, EXCEPT.

and that he will warrant and forever defend the same unto the said parties of the second part their heirs and assigns against said party of the first part, his heirs and assigns, and all and every person or persons whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
