

two years and over she has been living in Cannon City, Col., with her aunt; that she has returned to the city of Wagoner, Okla., her former home and expects to live on the allotment of the said Lillie Bell Winton; that petitioner charges the said Robert E. Lynch with continued failure to perform his duty as guardian of her said children in this, that he has failed to rent the land at Wagoner during the time he has been guardian of said children, has failed to pay to the petitioner anything for the support of said children except the sum of \$50.00, which he paid in Nov. 1907, that she wrote said guardian in reference to funds but received no answer, except the payment above referred to.

Petitioner further states that she wrote the guardian while in Colo., to file for Neva Irene Winton, but that she understands that he never made a filing as required under the law, and for this reason said minor failed to get an allotment of land in the Cherokee Nation; that said Guardian has not made his reports as required by law, and has generally neglected the duties as Guardian until petitioner is dissatisfied with him.

Wherefore, petitioner prays that the court discharge said Guardian; that he be required to make full and complete report of his trust and for such other relief as she may be entitled.
