SECOND.

No fences shall ever be erected upon the inside lot lines or elsewhere across said lots, but fences may be erected upon the west, south and east extremities of the entire tract herein replatted.

THIRD.

But one building shall be erected and placed on each lot, except garage or other necessary subsidiary buildings, none of which shall be placed within a distance of 5 feet of the west line of lot 14.

FOURTH.

The said property is hereby restricted in its use to residence purposes, which shall be construed to include apartments and subsidiary buildings as aforesaid.

FIFTH.

No material change shall be made at any time in the architectural design or line of the improvements which are now being erected and completed on said property.

SIXTH.

Nothing herein shall be construed as intended to deprive any owner of the right to replace any improvements destroyed by fire or the elements.
