But if said sum or sums of money of any part thereof, or any interest thereon is not paid when the same is due, and if the taxes and assessments of every nature which are or may be assessed and levied against said premises or any part thereof are not paid when same are made due and payable, the whole of said sum or sums, and interest, shall then become due and payable, and said parties of the second part shall be entitled to possession of said premises. And said parties of the first part for said consideration do hereby expressly waive an appraisal of said real estate and all benefits of the homestead exemption and stay laws of the State of Oklahoma.

ORDER APPROVING FULL BLOOD DEED.

Now, on this 13th day of August, 1923, the petition of Susie Harjo, now Fife, for an order approving her warranty deed conveying all her right, title and interest in and to the following described real estate, situate in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, described as follows, to-wit:
